ARMIDALE CATHOLIC SCHOOLS VAPING POLICY

1. INTRODUCTION

Vaping (the smoking of e-cigarettes¹) by young people, including school students, is a rapidly growing trend that has such significant health risks and impacts that Australian and international health authorities have labelled youth vaping a public health crisis.

2. STATEMENT OF COMMITMENT

Our school values and promotes the health, safety, and wellbeing of our students, staff, and other workers. We are committed to a *no-vaping Policy*, procedures, and intervention program to reduce the incidence and harmful impacts of vaping among our students and school community. This involves upholding the law.

3. SCOPE

This Vaping Policy applies:

- in all school workplaces, work and learning areas, premises and grounds
- to all students, staff, other workers, and visitors
- in all school activities, excursions, camps, events, and functions.

4. FRAMEWORK

The *Policy* is framed within and underpinned by:

• legislation regulating vaping products (e-cigarettes, pods and liquids) and smoking in schools The school's Work Health & Safety Policy, Alcohol & Other Drugs Policy, Living Well Learning Well framework.

5. KEY PRINCIPLES

Within the Scope of this Policy:

- 1. The possession, supply, promotion, or use of any vaping product is prohibited.
- 2. Parents and caregivers have a primary responsibility for developing and protecting the health and wellbeing of their children, including in the matter of vaping.
- 3. The school and school staff have a duty of care for the safety and wellbeing of students, staff, and other people, including in the matter of vaping.
- 4. If a staff member has reason to suspect a student of possessing, supplying, promoting, or using a vaping product, this is to be reported to a member of the school's Leadership Team.
- 5. Any vaping product or device found will be confiscated, secured, and removed from the school in accordance with hazardous waste ² disposal procedures (see <u>ATTACHMENT 1</u>)

¹ e-cigarettes are battery-operated devices that are activated by puffing and use heat to vapourise a liquid containing propylene glycol, other chemicals, and often nicotine that e-cigarette users inhale (or 'vape')

² e-cigarette batteries include lithium ion batteries that can explode when damaged or under pressure; vape liquids may contain nicotine and toxic chemicals that can cause poisoning and serious harm to children on ingestion.

- 6. With appropriate assistance and support for students, families, and others who may be involved, e-cigarette-related incidents will be dealt with according to the school's *Living Well Learning Well framework*
- 7. Resources to support school communities in raising awareness are accessible to staff through the Education Safety Hub and to parents and students through school communication channels.

6. **RESPONSIBILITIES**

Supported by the school Leadership Team and the Armidale Catholic Schools Office, **the Principal**, is responsible for:

- ensuring that the whole school community is made aware of the school's *Vaping Policy*, and is given adequate role-appropriate information and support the *Policy*
- ensuring that *Policy* aims, rules, and requirements are met and procedures are followed
- all responses to incidents of vaping are in accordance with the Armidale Catholic Schools Office
 Code of Conduct

Supported by the school Leadership Team and the Armidale Catholic Schools Office, **school staff** are responsible for:

- cooperating with and implementing the requirements of this *Policy*
- taking reasonable steps, according to this *Policy,* to prevent reasonably foreseeable harm occurring to any person from e-cigarettes or vaping
- referring, without delay, any vaping matters to the school's Leadership Team.

Supported by the principal, school Leadership Team and school staff, **students** are responsible for:

- cooperating and complying with the rules of this *Policy*
- following the instructions and directions of school staff
- supporting the wellbeing of their friends and other students.

ATTACHMENT 1 Vaping Device Confiscation and Disposal

When any actual or suspected vaping device (e-cigarette, vaping product, or vaping paraphernalia) is handed in or confiscated:

- 1. **bag the device** as soon as possible in an individual plastic bag
- 2. take the bagged device to the school office as soon as reasonably practicable
- 3. **inspect the device** for swelling, leaking and damage.
- 4. **If the device looks damaged** in any way, put on protective gloves, eyewear, and if possible, an apron.
 - Liquid nicotine is toxic and can cause poisoning if it touches skin or is accidentally ingested.
 - Damaged batteries can leak contents that cause burn or other injuries.
- 5. **Place the bagged device** in a separate, sealable, watertight, solid storage container such as a plastic (polyethylene) canister or bin.
- 6. **Add** sand, kitty litter, vermiculite or another fire containment material to the container.
 - Vaping device lithium-ion batteries are a known fire hazard and have been associated with fires, explosions, and serious injuries.
- 7. **Seal** the container.
- 8. Label the container 'Caution: Vaping Devices Hazardous Waste'.
- 9. **Store** the labelled hazardous vape waste where in a locked storage area in such a way that it cannot be damaged, knocked over, or accessed without authority.
- 10. **Keep** a fire extinguisher in the storage area.
- 11. **Arrange for removal** for proper recycling/disposal according to the school's Hazardous Waste Disposal Procedures.
- **12. Avoid stockpiling** vaping devices so that their potential to cause harm to people and property is kept to a minimum.
